John Deal (1784) was in the War of 1812. His father Conrad Deal was a “native of Bavaria”. Conrad settled in Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, and served during the Revolution. John married first Polly Willhime (1789-1815) and had three children: William (1808-1863), George (1810-1876), and Maria (1814-1876).

Barbara Gruber (1798) was born in Pennsylvania.

About Asa Deal

He was in the Civil War, a private in Company K, 13th Regiment, New York Infantry. He married in Avon and came to Allen’s Hill by 1870. The first two children were born in Avon; all the rest of the children were born in Richmond. His homestead was on Allen’s Hill Road (CR 40) just south of Allen’s Hill and the farm was later owned by his nephew George Deal. In the 1890s Asa served as Richmond’s Superintendent of Highways. He was Master of the Allen’s Hill Grange for four terms and a member of the West Bloomfield GAR Post.

His obituary was printed in the *Ontario County Journal*, February 5, 1915: “Asa Noah Deal, one of the well-known and respected residents of Allens Hill, died at his home on Friday evening at 8:30 of heart failure. He was a son of John and Barbara Gruber Deal, born February 14, 1842. He had seven own sisters and five own brothers, two half-brothers and two half-sisters [on father’s or mother’s side?]. His father was a soldier in the war of 1812. His grandfather, Conrad Deal, was a soldier of the revolutionary war. Mr. Deal was a soldier in the Civil war, having enlisted in the service in 1862 at the age of 20 years. At Round Top, battle of Gettysburg, he was shot through one lung, which always troubled him. He was a member of Sheridan-Crandall Post, G.A.R., East Bloomfield. Mr. Deal married Miss Margaret Patterson November 1, 1866 at Avon. She departed this life on February 24, 1907. This union was blessed with ten children, all of whom are living: Mrs. Elizabeth Adsitt, of Clifton Park; Mrs. Ella Holmes of Castile; Mrs. Harriet hughes, wife of Rev. David Hughes of Rupert, Vt.; Mrs. Mary Garlinghouse of Allen’s Hill; Mrs. Jennette Prior of Dundee; A.R. Deal of Victor; G. W. Deal, and Dr. J. E. Deal of Allen’s Hill; Mrs. Margaret Lilly of Angelica, and Mrs. Ruth Wiggins of Lima. He is also survived by sixteen grandchildren; and one sister Mrs. Emeline Wolfe of Alamo, Michigan. He was always a staunch adherent of the Republican Party. He was an active and busy man, for his was a long and well-rounded life. He was a kind and obliging neighbor, a loving husband and father, his delight seemed to be in having his children home often and in family gatherings. And

their hearts go out in hope that the lips that spoke to them so wisely cannot be forever silenced. He believed in God, in life and love's eternal triumph. He was long a faithful member of the Methodist Church of which Rev. W.W. Rothrock is pastor, and who conducted the funeral services at the home on Tuesday, when an appropriate sermon was preached. The flag that he had helped defend was draped across the top of his casket. Interment was made in Allen's Hill cemetery beside his wife. His children were all in attendance at the funeral."

NOTES

Margaret Patterson (1848) was born February 20, in Newark, New York. She was the daughter of George Patterson and Elizabeth Carrier.

Elizabeth Deal (1867) and **Mary Deal** (1873) were married on the same day. The *Ontario County Chronicle* reported on October 29, 1902: "Allen's Hill, N. Y. - A pretty double wedding was that of Miss Sarah Elizabeth Deal and James Martin Adsit, of Clifton Park, and Miss Mary Henrietta Deal and Stoughton Tracy Garlinghouse, of this place, which was celebrated at the pleasant home of the brides' parents, Mr. and Mrs. Asa N. Deal, last Wednesday at high noon.

"The house was daintily and artistically decorated with cut flowers and autumn leaves. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. J. S. Brown and Rev. David Hughes, brother-in-law of the brides, and was very impressive. Immediately after the ceremony an elaborate wedding breakfast was served. The brides were becomingly attired in dainty gowns of white Persian lawn trimmed with lace and carried bride roses.

"The beautiful and useful gifts, beside each received a sum of money. About 70 relatives and friends were in attendance and had a most delightful time. Mr. and Mrs. Adsit will make their future home in Clifton Park, where the groom is engaged in business. Mr. and Mrs. Garlinghouse are both popular young people, and have the kindly wishes of a host of friends; they will reside here.

"The guests from abroad were Mr. and Mrs. Welcher, Mr. Williams and Misses Maveret and Ethel Williams of Newark; Mrs. W. W. Brown and Miss A. Brown of Penfield, Mr. and Mrs. Patterson of Mertensia, Miss Raymond of Canandaigua, Mr. and Mrs. Deal and daughters of Lima, Mr. and Mrs. Dibble of Honeoye Falls, Mr. and Mrs. Ward and daughter, Irene, of Livonia, Mrs. Warren and Miss Synes of Rochester, Dr. and Mrs. Wilbur, Mr. and Mrs. F. R. Hoagland of Honeoye, Mrs. Frank Senn of West Bloomfield, Miss Alice Dubois and A. R. Deal of Victor, Mr. and Mrs. E. G. Briggs and sons of Bristol, Misses Janette and Ruth Deal of East Bloomfield, Miss Minnie Norgate of Canadice, Mr. and Mrs. Holmes and daughter of Castile, Rev. and Mrs. David Hughes and children of Clifton Park."

Ella Caroline Deal (1869) was born October 26. She married March 29, 1899 Joseph Holmes (who died in 1942). Their children were Margaret, George, Robert, and Vincent.

George Wolfe Deal (1881) married Edith Norget and had five children: Elsie (1910), Asa (1912-1971), Edith, Caroline (married Floyd Shilling), and George. Edith Norget was born in Canadice August 18, 1881, the daughter of James Norget (born in England) and Emily Doolittle (born in Canadice). She died November 6, 1935 in Allens Hill. George died June 6, 1939. They are both buried in Allens Hill Cemetery.

Elsie Deal (1910) died March 22, 1974 and is buried in Allens Hill Cemetery.

Edith ("Barbara") Deal Barbara Deal married Carroll Titsworth; in her brother's obituary she is listed as a sister of George W. Deal.

George W. Deal (c. 1920) was the son of George Wolfe Deal and Edith Norget. He was born about 1920 and died December 18, 1980. His wife was Eleanor (July 20, 1922 – June 8, 1988), and his children were Cathie and George. He and his wife are buried in Allens Hill Cemetery.

Margaret Louise Deal (1884) was born January 7. (Some sources give her name as Marjorie.) She died January 6, 1964.

John Ellis Deal (1889) was born June 3, 1889. He married Grace Mildred Johnson (the daughter of John J. Johnson) on November 17, 1915. In 1911 he graduated from Cornell College of Veterinary Medicine with a DVM Degree. He practiced in Allen's Hill from 1912-1927, and also operated a general store there. He was in living in Victor in 1920. Then relocated to Vernon Center in 1930, where he lived when he died. He had three sons: John (1917), Roy (1922), and Edward (1923); and three daughters: Ruth (1919), Marian (1920), and Harriet (1929). He died September 14, 1973.
