 Monday 7/5 water clarity of 11.5 feet & surface water temperature of 75.9 F. Started noticing very light amounts of Gleoetrichia, an early summer blue-green algae species, in late June. First lake wide Gleoetrichia bloom observe on 7/5. Nearby Finger Lakes reported their first blue-green algae blooms in late June to early July too.

Weed Harvesting Program Update

 Ontario County has hired a dump truck driver, a weed harvester operator, and two part time barge crew members.
